Honorary Secretary Report

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is both an honour and a challenge to present my Secretary's Report to this year's Annual General Meeting. I am very conscious that this has been a turbulent and, at times, difficult year for the administration of our sport. The fact that I am the fourth Secretary of Pitch and Putt Ireland to serve during this year is in itself a reflection of those challenges.

Administration and Governance

NEC meetings have occasionally been turbulent, and decisions made by this NEC will affect the future direction of our Association for years to come. In particular, the NEC's decision this year not to apply for any "Dormant Accounts Grants" for 2026 may have long-term implications for our eligibility to secure these grants in the future. It is my strongly held belief that the primary objective of the NEC should be to support our players and clubs as our first priority, ahead of the institutions of the game.

We recently underwent a comprehensive audit by Sport Ireland. While the audit commended much of our work, it also identified several key areas of governance that require our immediate attention—particularly with regards to modernising our structures and improving transparency and accessibility. These must remain our focus going forward.

Communication and Outreach

Despite these hurdles, this year has also seen immense improvements in our engagement with players and clubs. I am proud to report that the lines of communication have never been more open. We have introduced modern technologies, including live streaming of events, digital scoreboards, and improved communication channels, bringing us closer as an organisation.

We have also taken significant steps towards launching online competition entries. This innovation will greatly reduce administrative workload and decrease the chance of errors, making participation more seamless for everyone involved.

Playing Success and Development

Our sporting performance this year has been nothing short of inspiring. I was delighted to see all of our players who won titles during the year achieve their goals—every one of them should be immensely proud of their accomplishments. We have celebrated European Championship successes, seen the expansion of ranking events, and promoted inclusiveness within Inter and Junior grades.

Our working partnerships with the Ladies' game and the implementation of a far-reaching coaching programme are laying solid foundations for the future. These initiatives are already resulting in an increase in registered members, and we remain optimistic about both new and returning clubs becoming part of our community.

Education and Training

We have not only focused on playing but also on knowledge and safety. This year we offered a suite of online and in-person courses, including:

- Accountant workshops for clubs
- First Aid
- Chainsaw and Spraying Safety
- Governance and GDPR training
- Grant Applications
- Vetting and Protection
- Coaching

Our commitment to upskilling and education is for everyone—players, volunteers, and officials alike.

Acknowledgements

None of our achievements would be possible without the dedicated staff members in the office. I would like to extend my sincere thanks to Dwyne, Miriam, Norma, Niamh and Beverly for being the backbone of our operations throughout the year.

A Closing Wish

If I could make one wish, it would be a simple one: that every member of Pitch and Putt Ireland plays this wonderful game with a smile. Enjoy the sport, play it to your own capacity, and remember the health and wellbeing benefits it offers. Ours truly is one of the world's most accessible competitive sports, and I hope that we continue to promote it as such.

Thank you all for your support throughout the year. I look forward to working together towards an even brighter future for Pitch and Putt Ireland.

Communications & Press Officer Report

Taking on the role of Communications Officer halfway through the year has been both a challenge and a valuable learning experience. It has become clear to me that communication within our organisation isn't just a side responsibility—it needs to be a dedicated role in its own right, to ensure we effectively engage with our members and attract newcomers to our sport. Maybe I did not achieve all I wished for during the year, perhaps next year can build on some of the initiatives.

I often describe our sport as “The Family of Pitch and Putt,” and it's a family I wish to see grow. The key to that growth is active and consistent communication using every medium available to us. Last year, we established the “Broadcast Group” to professionalise our approach and methods for delivering our message. Our investment in streaming this year is a positive step, not just for showcasing Pitch and Putt to a wider audience, but also for creating a historical archive of our events—a resource that serves players and supporters alike, allowing them to revisit fond memories.

However, while streaming has its place, our priority must remain encouraging participation in live events, which are the backbone of all we do. Our goal should be to ensure these events are not only worth watching online but are engaging and rewarding for those who attend in person. Building spectator experience is an ambition we must strive towards.

Our journey into new media continues, led especially by the younger members of our community. We are making progress in managing and delivering high-quality multimedia content across platforms, though it is a learning curve. The recent decision to relaunch "Backspin" as a podcast featuring multiple contributors is an exciting development, and distributing this series across platforms like Spotify and YouTube will help us reach a broader audience.

We have chosen to focus our content output on YouTube rather than Facebook, due to Facebook's policy of deleting live content after one month. We want Pitch and Putt's moments of glory to last far longer—these memories matter to both players and fans. Lost footage means lost legacy.

Becoming relevant to sponsors is essential for our continued growth and higher exposure. To do this, we must offer real value and support to sponsors, which requires us to invest in ourselves and build the organisation we aspire to be. Unfortunately, this requires investment - investment we should not shirk away from.

This year has truly been a team effort. I wish to extend my deepest thanks to our staff—Dwyne, Miriam, Norma, Beverly, and Niamh—and to the dedicated volunteers who generously give their time and energy to support our game. Special thanks must go to Mr John Manning, so often the hidden glue in our organisation, and to so many others—Philip Warner, John Ross Crangle, Joe Price, Derek O'Driscoll, Mark Keohane, John Plunkett,

Pat Kirwan, Frank Naughton, Mick Cunningham, Suzanne Jordan, Marina O'Rourke and many more. I am sincerely grateful to what I continue to call the family of Pitch and Putt.

- Same format as 2025 for all grades

Ladies National Match Play

- A gross championship will be held in each grade.
- In the senior grade, the draw will be seeded.

National Scotch Foursomes

- Prizes will be given for lady/lady pairings

Provincial Ladies Intercounty

- Leinster and Munster championship will follow the format of 2025 Leinster Intercounty.

National Ladies Intercounty

- Ladies' teams will consist of 5 players. Counting scores will be two scotch foursomes scores plus four single stroke play scores.

Ladies Ranking Events

- Two ladies ranking events will be part of the fixtures list

Looking ahead into 2026, there are a number of items that need to be addressed. Here are some of them:

1. The ladies handicap system
2. Coaching
3. Ways to increase participation in the game

Finally! It has been an honour and a privilege to hold the position of National Ladies Officer on the NEC during 2025.
