National Matchplay Championship @ St. Bridgets



Glourious sunshine and heat greeted the players and spectators at the excellent St. Bridgets course which hosted the National Matchplay championship over the June bank holiday weekend. The course was in exceptional condition which firmed up over the duration of the weekend adding to the challenge facing the players. However, it did not prevent outstanding performances being produced and a brillant championship overall. The following takes a look at the championship and our new National champions.

Ladies National Matchplay

For the fourth time in the last five championsips a new first time winner of the ladies scratch matchplay title was crowned. Following first time wins for Mary Murrary (2019), Martha O'Brien (2020) and Liz Quinn (2022) it would be **Oldcastle's Paula Lynch** who would claim the 2023 title in St. Bridget's. With the ladies scrarch championship now reduced to a final field of 16 (and a straight knockout format), as always the championship was very competitive with the best ladies in the country participating.

Paula entered the championship quietly under many peoples radar but left on the bank holiday Monday a deserved champion and someone that will challenge for many more senior titles in the future after her excellent performance. Paula commenced her championship on the Saturday and recorded a comprehensive 10&9 win over Lucan's Siobhan Keely. Next up for Paula on the Sunday in the quarter final would be previous winner of this event, Breda White (Tipperary Hills). This would prove a very closely contested match with both ladies all square through 18 and with six holes to go Breda would hold a 2 hole advantage. Paula however dug deep over the closing holes of the regulation 36 to force the match into extra holes where she would claim victory on the 38th and proceed to the semi final. In the semi finals on Monday morning Paula faced the 2019 champion Mary Murray. Unfazed by her first appearance in a national matchplay semi final Paula would take the early lead in this match and never relinquish it. Paula turned 4up on Mary and moved to 5 up with 12 to go and while Mary would

win the odd hole from there it would be Paula who controlled the semi final to run out a 3&2 victor and enter her first matchplay final. Here opponent would be Chrissie Sheedy (Ryston) who was returning to action for the first time in 2023 in this championship. Depsite her lenghtly absence Chrissie had a very impressive run in the championship defeating Liz Quinn of Collinstown (and defending champion) in round 1 by 3&1 and followed this by defeating her sister and 2023 Leinster matchplay champion Marian Courtrey (Ryston) 1 up in the quarters. In the semi final on the Monday moring Chrissie would defeat club mate Tara Dillon (Ryston) by a comfortable margin of 6&5 to move into her 12th national matchplay final and seeking her 7th title. In a final which was played in breezy but sunny condititions over a very firm St. Bridgets course, the consistently excellent pitching and putting from Paual Lynch would prove the deciding factor in the final. Paula won the first two holes and never looked back from this point retaining the lead throughout the final. Her flawless performance (the best she has ever pitched in her own words), and a pretty much error free game were pivtol which saw Paula race to a surprising 6up lead after 14 holes. Both ladies traded holes over the final few holes of round 1 but Paula would retain the 6up advantage through 18. Paula continued her excellent play in the second 18 holes and while Chrissie never gave up and tried to chip away at the 6 hole deficit, Paula retained a 5up advantage with 9 to play, responding almost immediately to any hole Chrissie won in a rounds where very few holes were halved. Chrissie reduced the leaded to 4 after the 12 and when it looked liked she would get it back to 3 with 5 to play and keep the pressure on, Paula produced an excellent par from off the back of the 13th at this key point in the match to keep it a 4up and all but secure the title. In the end Paula closed out the matched with a 3&2 victory and very deservedly lift the 2023 national matchplay title. Paula became the second player from Co. Meath to become National Ladies Matchplay champion and the first since Ann Hall of Royal Meath at Seapoint in Millennium year.

Gent National Matchplay

In the gents matchplay Stephen O'Reilly (Hillview) emerged the triumphant winner at the end of the long gents matchplay weekend wiining all six of his matches. Stephen becomes the second Tipperary player in history to win the National Matchplay championship as he joins Eoin Morrissey (1961) as a Hillview winner of the National Gents Matchplay championship. Stephen's win in 2023 comes not long after his previous semi final appearance in 2020 where he lost to eventual winner Kieran Earls (Bruff) on that occasion. Enroute to the title this year Stephen saw off the challenge of Darren McNally (Bagnelstown) 7&6 in the first round on Saturday. Stephens closest match of the weekend came in round 2 against Jason O'Reagan (Tralee). This match was nip and tuck throughout with Jason taking a 1 up lead with six to go. However Stepehen would produce the strongest finish over the last six holes and take the win on the final hole 1 up. In the last 16, Stephen defeated one of the pre tournament favourites in the form of George McGreal. All square throught 18, an excellent second round from Stepehen saw him take the match by 3&2. John Walsh (Collins) was Stephen's quarter final opponent where Stepehen would pretty much control this match throughout. Turning 4up after 18 Stephen proceeded to defeat John on a score of 6&5. It would be another Cork man awaiting Stephen in the semis on Monday morning, Peter Donavon (Bishopstown). As he had done all weekend excellent pitching and exceptional putting would see Stephen have the upper hand through this match also. 3up after 18 he would close it out with a 5&3 win to reach hist first National matchplay final. Facing Stephen in the final would be John Cahill (Fermoy). John was making his appearance in the final for the second year running having lost to Barry Morrissey (Bishopstown) in Douglas in 2022. John had a very impressive run to the final with wins against Tony Blake (Tralee) 7&6, John O'Leary (Douglas) 4&3, John Sloane (Cunnigar) 5&4, Padraig Mallon (Trim) 7&6 and in the semi an 8&7 win over Jim Judge Jnr (MacBride). In the final it would be Stephen who struck early on and who continued his excellent play and in particular putting throughout. Similar to his previous rounds Stephen built a strong 3up advantage through 18, an advantage he would not relinquish enroute to winning the prestigious National Matchplay title by a margin of 6&5.

Ladies Nett National Matchplay

The Ladies Nett matchplay saw sixteen ladies take to the tee on Saturday, all with aspirations of lifting the cup come Monday afternoon. This championship took the form of a 18 hole round robin format on Saturday and Sunday to get down to a final 8 where it would be 18 hole knockout match play from this point where handicaps would play a key part throughout. Come Monday afternoon it would be the Leinster junior matchplay champion Audrey Donnelly (MacBride) who would add the National Nett matchplay title to her honours with a 2up victory over Christina Foley (Athgarvan) in the final. Having navigated through the round robin stage, Audrey faced Theresa King (RGSC) in the guarterfinal where she would have a 5&3 win and set up a semi final match against Grainne Shelley (Larkspur Park). This was a very close match with the game all square through 12. However Audrey would critically win three of the next four holes and secure a 3&2 victory to reach her first final. Her final opponent Christina had defeated Margerat Connelly (Trim) 3&2 and Veronica Anglim (Hillview) 7&6 in the knockout stage get to the final. It would prove to be an even matched final for the majoirty, however, Audrey's experience on the final stage would come to the fore to ensure she headed down the final hole with a 1up lead. With a few putts to spare Audrey would make par on the last hole and claim a 2up victory and take the title of National Nett championship for 2023.

Intermediate and Junior Challenge

A new initiative was introduced by the NEC this year which welcomed the winners of the provincal intermediate and junior championship, played a number of weeks earlier, to play against each other on the Monday afternoon alongside the other three National championship finals above. Played over 36 holes, the junior match saw Leinster junior matchplay champion **James Casey (Gowran)** face Munster junior matchplay champion Colin Hennessey (St. Annes). James has played in the National gents matchplay already that weekend and had a number of very impressive wins so was very familiar with the course that weekend which may have proved a benefit to James as he would go on to record a comfortable 9&7 victory over Colin and take home this inagural junior prize. In the intermediate match, another player who featured in the main championship was Munster intermediate matchplay champion Philip Burns (Brinny) take on **Wayne Allen (St. Patricks)** who recently won the Leinster intermediate matchplay championship. In this battle it would be Wayne who would take the win. Wayne would turn 1up but both players would trade holes across the match but in the end Wayne would hold out to claim a 2&1 win and take the prize back to Enniscorthy.

National Seniors Strokeplay Championship @ Glenville

Glenville played host to the National Seniors Strokeplay championship in June and delivered an immaculate but challenging course for the championship. Below is a review of the winners over the weekend.



Anthony Malone (Lucan) joins Frank Ryan and Pat Greene as three-time winners of the National Gents Seniors Senior Grade Strokeplay championship. A brillant display of pitch and putt over the tricky but immaculate Glenville course saw Anthony finish on 13 under par with rounds of 47 + 48. Leading after the first 18, Anthony never let the lead go and closed out an excellent win. Closest to him and runner up would be Frank O'Donoghue (Rafeen Creek). Two very solid rounds of 49 would see Frank finish on 10 under par and take silver with fellow Cork man Declan Freeman (Fermoy) being a further two shots back on 8 under following two rounds of 50. Rounds of 53 and 51 and 4 under total would secure the gents intermediate title for Gerald JJ Quirke (Fermoy). Gerald's excellent score would prove to be the only score under par on the day and give him a 4 shot victory over Dominic Kavanagh (Bruff) who finished on level par along with four other players. Dominic excellent back 18 score of 50 would secure him the silver medal with Dermot Heffernan (Lucan) taking home the bronze medal on the back 9 from Ian Leech (St. Annes). Gerard JJ Quirke becomes the sixth different Cork player in history to win the National Gent's Senior Intermediate title. Nicky Byrne (Collins) became the second player from Collins to win the National Gents Seniors Junior Grade. An excellent score of 2 over (55 + 55) would given Nicky a two shot victory of Benny McCarthy (ESB) on 4 over (56 + 56) ensuring a Cork 1-2 who claimed the runner up spot on the back 18 from Oliver Plunkett (54 + 58). Thomas McInerney (Cloughue) will forever be known as the man who collected the initial National Gents Seniors Junior B Grade Strokeplay crown. A score of 16 over (61 + 63) was good enough to take the title back to Cloghogue. Runner up was Seamus Gleeson

(Riverdale) on 19 over (64 + 63) with Vincent O'Brien (Bellowstown) taking third spot with a score of 21 over (64 + 65)



Geraldine Ward (Portmarknock) claimed her first National Seniors Senior ladies title in Glenville with a comortbale 5 shot victory over runner up Ger Holland (RGSC) with fellow clubmate Sheelagh Elmes (Portmarknock) back in third. A brillant score of 4 under (53 + 51) would see Geraldine become the seventh former winner of the National Ladies Strokeplay Championship to also win the National Ladies Seniors Senior Grade Strokeplay Championship (joining Margaret Hogan, Sheelagh Elmes, Rose Kelly, Chris O'Shaughnessy, Ann Maloney and Breda White on that particular list). Ger Holland took second place in the National Ladies O55 Senior Grade Strokeplay Championship eight years after her win in the event at Old County follwing her rounds of 53 + 56.



Mary Quinn (Lakeside) is the new Ladies Senior Intermediate champion. Rounds of 54 +61 gave Mary a final total of 7 over and a comfortable 5 shot victory over home place Joyce Keane Glenville who finised on 12 over (60 + 60). It would be another Tipperary player Liz Forde (Riverdale) who would take third place in this grade with a score of 16 over (63 + 61). **Anne Sweeney (St. Bridgets)** reclaimed the junor title five year after winning it last in McDonagh. In a very closely contested grade Anne's score of 24 over (69 + 63) was good enough to give her a one shot victory over Nora O'Meara

(Glenville) on 25 over (58 + 75) with Bernadette Morgan (Glenville) also on the host club a further shot back on 26 over (66 + 68)

Munster Championship Reviews

Munster Matchplay Championships @ Tralee

Tralee played host to the 2023 Munster Ladies and Gents matchplay and delievered the course in excellent condition allowing for exciting and a very competitive championship to follow.



Jason Cregan (Tralee) claimed his first senior provincal title on his home course with a very impressive victory in a top quality field. Jason began his challenge with a 2&1 victory over the experienced Declan Freeman (Fermoy) on Saturday and followed this up with a strong 3&2 win over Christopher Gibney (Listowel). On Sunday morning Jason faced off against Eoin Walsh (Collins) where a very strong last 9 holes saw him close out a 1up victory having been 2 down with 9 to play. In the semi final Jason would overcome the strong challenge of James Cleary (Larkspur Park) where the match sat at all square through 18. Jason however would move 3up after 27 holes and hole on to take the win on the 35th hole. In the final Jason would face Ray Murphy (St Anne) who came off the back of an excellent 1up win against Bryan Delaney (Bishopstown) in the semi final. It would be Jason who was quickest out of the blocks in the final racing to a 3up lead through 9 holes, a gap that Ray was unable to close. In the end Jason closed out an excellent win on a score of 6&5 to claim his first senior matchplay title.

In the ladies senior section four ladies were entered so the championship started off with the semi final pairings. Mary Murray (Rocklodge) took on Sarah Byrne (Fermoy) in the first match. This would prove to be a one sided affair on this occasion with Mary running out a comfortable 7&6 winner. The other semi final between Breda White (Tipp Hills) and **Sarah O'Neill (Collins)** would be a much closer contest. Sarah took a 2up lead after 9 and it would be a lead she would not let go of and close out the match

with a 2&1 victory over Breda. In the all Cork final it would be Sarah who would stamp her mark on the match early with some excellent play and turn 4up after 18. Sarah would continue to drive forward in the second 18 and in the end close out a comfortable 8&7 victory to claim the senior title.

Philip Byrne (Brinny) is the new Munster gents intermediate matchplay champion after a 7&6 win in Sunday morning's semi-final against Deerpark's James Fleming and the Brinny player followed this up with a victory over local Tralee member Keith O'Brien by 5&4 in their decider. In a titanic battle, Keith O'Brien survived on the first extra hole of his semi-final joust with David White (Larkspur Park) to make it to the final.

The intermeidate ladies grade would also just see four player compete. However the semi finals proved there was very little to separate the ladies involved. Semi final one saw Elaine Quinn (Lakeside) secure a final hole win over Mairead Manning (St Stephens) in a match where there was never more than a hole or two between the ladies. A very similar battle entailed in the second semi final where home player **Lisa O'Connor (Tralee)** would have a final hole victory over Margaret Hennessey (Riverdale) with another 1up victory. In the final, home advantage would play a key part as Lisa O'Connor would claim the title with a 3&2 win over Elaine Quinn in an entertaining and competitive championship final.

Colin Hennessy (St. Annes) added the provincial gents junior matchplay crown to the Cork Matchplay title he won a few week earlier. Having qualified for the Munster final with a 5&3 semi-final victory over E.S.B.'s Ger Dinan (ESB), Hennessy denied club-mate Dean Lonergan by 8&6 in the decider which was Dean's second successive runner-up performance in this event. In another all-Cork semi-final, Dean Lonergan ran out a 4&3 victor over Korey Murphy (Rafeen Creek) earlier that morning.

Tralee would have further success in the ladies junior championship where **Catriona O'Connor (Tralee)** would clinch the junior title defeating clubmate Rosemaire O'Sullivan (Tralee) in the final by a score of 6&4. As with the other ladies grades it was a field of four and in the semi finals Catriona would defeat Angela Royer (Bishopstown) by 3&2 while Rosemaire would enjoy a victory over Lesley Gilmore (Bishopstown) on a score of 8&7.

Munster Strokeplay Championships @ Fermoy

The beautiful Fermoy course was the host for this years Munster Ladies and Gents strokeplay championship for all grades. A course which has seen some excellent scoring in past championships, it did not disapppoint again this year with the standard of play and exceptional scoring.



Local player Daithi Sexton (Fermoy) would caputre the pretigious senior gents title with an outstanding performance. His score of 33 under would win by four shots from Paudie O'Sullivan (Majestic) on 29 under with Byran Delaney (Bishopstown) taking the bronze medal with a final score of 27 under. Daithi would lead after 36 holes having recorded rounds of 44 and 43 to sit on 21 under.. Despite the heavy pressure on leading, Daithi would go even lower in the final 18 and shoot a brillant 12 under 42 to secure the title. An exceptional final 18 of 40 from Paudie shot him up the leaderboard while the

final groups remainded on the course. However his flawless round would only be good

enough for the silver. A final total of 16 under would see **Darren Temple (St. Stephens)** edge a very closely contested intermediate championhip where only 3 shots seperated the top 7 players. Tied on 13 under with David O'Leary (Douglas) after 36 holes, a solid round of 51 from Darren in the final 18 would see him finish 1 clear of John Farrell (Bruff). His final round of 49 would see him claim second place on a total of 15 under from David O'Leary who picked up the bronze, courtsey of a better back 18. There was further success for Cork





clubs in the gents junior A championship as **Martin Sullivan (St. Annes)** would have a comfortable 4 shot victory over Gerard Dinan (ESB). Martin posted a final total of 10 under.par while Gerard on 6 under.

Michael Creagh (Tralee) took the final podium spot on level par. **Stephen Hanley** (**Bruff)** would have the honour of winning

the very first junior B championship introduced for the first time this year. He shot a brillant score of 1 over for 36. Runner up was awarded to Thomas Roberts



(Lakeside) and third going to Paul Hayes (Listowel) who returned scores of 10 and 11 over repectively.



Further success for the Fermoy club came in the ladies championship with home player **Sarah Byrne (Fermoy)** winning the ladies senior title. With the ladies championship being 36 holes, Sarah returned a winning score of 2 under to claim a 2 shot win over Sarah O'Neill (Collins). Third spot went to Michelle McCarthy (Tipp Hills) with a final score of 3 over par. Adding to the celebration in the Fermoy club and not to be outdone by husband Daithi, **Ailsih Sexton**

(Fermoy) took home the ladies intermeditate title with an excellent final score of 1 over. Ailish's round of 55 and 52 would see her finshed 3 shots clear of Paula Nolan (Rocklodge) who finished on 4 over with Margaret Forder (Riverdale) taking third spot on the back 18 with 5 over. It would be a clean sweep for Cork



clubs in the ladies championship as **Nuala McNamara (Collins)** won the ladies junior



championship on 21 over par. Nuala would finish well clear of the rest of the field with Gillian Morrissey (St. Annes) and Eileen Hanley (Ranger) a further 9 and 10 shots back respectively.

U16 Matchplay Championships @ St. Stephens

All roads led to the St. Stephen's club in Cork for the 2023 U16 Munster matchplay. Play got underway in earnest with everyone keen to get their hands on the silverware at the end of the day. The first round of matches determined the players in the cup and shield competition. The boys cup championship would be dominated by the boys from Kerry with the two semi finals being an all Kerry affair. In the first semi, A Jay Barrett (Listowel) would defeat Brian McCarthy (Deerpark) 2&1 in a very closely contested and high quality match. While in the other semi final, two Deerpark

A very competitve battle continued between the two young stars but Nathan would hold on to his advtange over the second round and close out the match and claim the title with a 4&3 win.





In the girsl championhip **Megan Ahern (Collins)** would lift the girls title following a very competiive match against Sarah Ryan (Tipperary Hills). Both girls played some excellent pitch and putt but in the end it would be Megan who would prevail on a score line of 6&5. There is no doubt both girls will meet again in championship action in the coming years as they are the future stars of ladies pitch and putt.

Leinster Matchplay Championships @ St. Patricks and Bagenalstown

The courses of St. Patrick's in Wexford and Bagenalstown in Carlow were the joint hosts of this years Leinster Ladies and Gents Matchplays. Both courses were presented in excellent condition and were exceptional hosts throughout the weekend. Bagenalstown hosted the senior and intermediate gents matches for rounds 1 through to the quarter finals on Saturday with the semi finals and finals played in St. Patricks on Sunday. St. Patricks would be the venue for the full ladies and junior gents championship.



In the Senior sections it would be double success for Kildare clubs. In the lan Dillon aents (St. Bridgets) would win his first senior provincial title defeating Stephen Murrary (Old County) 3&2 in the final while Marian Courtney (**Ryston**) claimed the senior



ladies title, a title she last won in McDonagh back in 2002, with a 5&4 victory over Liz Quinn (Collinstown) in the final. Enroute to the final Ian defeated Dessie Baker (Lough Owel) 5&4 and Dean Grannell (St. Patricks) 3&2 in Bagenalstown. He proceeded to defeat Sean O'Connor (Erry) 3&2 in the quarters followed by a semi final win against George McGreal (Old County) 5&4. In the final Ian would find himself 2 down after 18. However, he would produce an excellent fight back over the second 18 against Stephen to close out a 3&2 victory. In the ladies, Marian started her campagin with a premlinary match against Bridie Cummins (Trim) with a 11&10 win. Marian followed this with a 3&2 victory over her sister Margarget Keogh (Ryston) in the quarter and a 7&6 win over clubmate Tara Dillon (Ryston) in the semi final. In the final, Marian continued her excellent form in the championship and built an early lead in the match again Liz which she would not relinquish to close out a 5&4 win and lift the title.



In the gents intermediate championship it would be home success as **Wayne Allen (St. Patricks)** secured a comprehensive win in the final against another player from the CKW region in the form of Mark Comerford (Gowan). Wayne's route to the final like the senior gents would be carved out across Bagnelstown and St. Patrick's. He claimed wins over Ross Sweeney (Lough Owel) 6&4, a very closely contested win against Kevin Knox (Gowran) 1up and a quarter final victory by 7&6 over Donald Kelly (Trim). A titantic semi final match against Patrick Robinson (Gowran) saw this match go to the 39th hole where Wayne would pip Patricks in this encounter. In the final, Wayne playing on his home course started brillantly and raced

to a 7up lead after 18. A margin too much for Mark to come back from and Wayne closed out the match with a comprenshive 11&9 victory to claim the title. A field of seven intermediate ladies took to the tee in St. Patrick's over the weekend, in what would prove to be a very competive championship. Leinster Strokeplay Championships @ Royal Meath & Seapoint

Royal Meath welcomed all the ladies grades for this years Leinster Strokeplay Championship and the venue provided the ladies with a fair but challenging set up. The weather would prove wet and windy for the majority of the day but that did not prevent some excellent pitch and putt to be played across all grades.



Following her brillant National Matchplay win in St. Bridget's less than six weeks earlier, **Paula Lynch (Oldcastle)** would again come up trumps in Royal Meath and claim her first senior provincial title with a one shot victory. Rounds of 53 + 50, which included a hole in one late on, would see her return a score of 5 under par and pip the defending champion Chrissie Sheedy (Ryston) by a single shot over the 36 hole format. Chrissie's rounds of 51 + 53 had set the clubhouse lead until Paula returned the winning

score late on. Paula and Chrissie's were the only score under par on the day as Glenda Hoey (Lucan) would take the thrid spot on level par. There was further joy for Meath

clubs in the ladies intermediate championship as former multiple girls champion **Sophie Farnan (Skryne)** won her first ladies championship (and certainly wont be her last!). A fantastic score of 1 over (56 + 53) would see her lift the title by a shot from Barbara Furlong (Lucan) on 2 over (56 + 54). The senior championship took centre stage in the afternoon and at the end of play it would be success for home player **Darren Fagan (Seapoint)**. Leading on 15 under after 36 holes, with a two shot advantage Darren would continue his excellent play over the course of the final 18. Not unexpectedly, pressure came from the chasing pack. Eamon Gibney (Castletown) took the club house lead following a final 18 round of 46 to post a score of 20 under. Darren however responded with an equally impressive 47 final 18 and finished on 22 under to claim the title. Eamon would secure the silver medal while third place went to Christopher Gallagher (Lucan) on 19 under following a better final 9 from Gary Healy (Loughlinstown).

Previous National Ladies and Gents Strokeplay's in Tipperary by John Manning

Gents

1973 National Ladies Strokeplay championship

It's almost 50 years since the National Ladies Strokeplay championship was first played in Co. Tipperary – at Hillview in heatwave conditions on 9th September 1973. The top lady player of the era, Clare Keating (Woodvale) captured the senior championship with a 36-hole aggregate of 105, which earned the Leeside legend a four-stroke victory over fellow Corkonian Marie Allen (St. Anne's). Three over after two holes, Clare was undaunted and recovered to even par at halfway before shooting 51 second time. Mary O'Rourke (Majestic) signed for 113, which delivered a two-stroke winning margin over runner-up Josephine O'Callaghan (Hillview). Junior champion was Meta Collins-Powell (Woodvale) whose 129 proved two better than Kay O'Reilly(Glenville).

1975 National Ladies Strokeplay Championship

Clare Keating lifted her sixth and final national Ladies Strokeplay title when the championships returned to Hillview just two year later in 1975 (7th September). The Cork star fired two holesin-one (at the 15th first time and at No. 7 in round two) as she compiled an impressive 98 for a five-shot cushion over her great rival, Shandon's Teresa McGuigan. It was a Cork 1-2 at intermediate level with Helen McDonnell (Douglas) shooting three under par to deny Liz Cronin (St. Anne's) by a brace. The junior championship required a three-way play-off after Marion Nolan (Campions), Jane O'Leary(Rocklodge) and Gertie McDonnell (Collins) all scored 121. The Dublin lady prevailed in extra-time with Jane O'Leary filling second place.

1988 National Ladies Strokeplay Championships at Hillview

Sunday 26th June dawned wet and dismal in Clonmel. The picturesque Hillview course, presented as always in impeccable condition, was a fitting test for the country's top lady players. In senior, one of the early starters, Shandon's Georgina Forristal(who had partnered Clare Keating at Hillview thirteen years previously) compiled two consistent rounds of 49 and 48 to set a hot pace on 97. Multiple national champion and the toughest of competitors, Margaret Hogan (Tullamore) came to the last at ten under par. Her pitch finished just off the green and her brave chip for a tie came up agonisingly short. The par left Georgina still one clear. Holder Breda Lonergan (Tipperary Hills) posed the last main threat to the Shandon lady's supremacy. Playing at the tail of the field, which is the champion's privilege, Breda put up an admirable defense of her title. Her return of 101, however, proved four too many and Georgina Forristale merged a worthy champion. Athgarvan's Martina Loakman dominated the intermediate championship with a two-round tally of one under par. That turned out to be five better than Cork player Siobhán Foy (Rocklodge) in second place with Dubliner Helen Grimes (R.G.S.C.) another four strokes back in third spot. Martina's Athgarvan club colleague

Aine Brennan really turned on the style in a nine-hole play-off for the junior championship. Boosted by an ace at the fifth, Aine Brennan posted 24 for the extra holes to see off the challenge of gallant runner-up Ros ORourke (Crosshaven). The pair had earlier tied on 119. Home club player Joan Morrissey (Hillview) took the bronze medal with 11.

Lakeside 2000

1998 National Matchplay champion Ray Murphy, from the Templebreedy club in Crosshaven, turned in a superb performance to win the Millennium National Strokeplay championship on Sunday 2 July at the Lakeside club in Templemore. Ray, who was twice third (1994 and 1995) put together fabulous rounds of 44, 43 and 48 to win by five shots from Paul Bray of the Collinstown club in Co.Westmeath. Third place went to reigning National Matchplay Champion, Mark Millar of Cement, who finished on 141.

Murphy's 21 under par 36-hole total of 87 saw him head the 20 gualifiers who made it through to the final 18 holes of the Paddy Old Irish Whiskey sponsored event. At this stage, he led by two from Brayvand by five from Millar and 1995 Strokeplay champion, Chris Scannell of Collins. Bray birdied two of the first three holes in the final round to briefly level matters but Murphy stepped up a gear and when Paul Bray bogeyed the long 8th, Ray regained the lead and ran out a convincing winner. Paul Bray gamely birdied the last two holes to edge out Millar, who had earlier birdied the same two holes to overtake Chris Scannell, who finished fourth and took the final exempt slot for 2001. In Saturdays' Intermediate Championship, Barry Hill from the McBride club in Drogheda scored 49 and 50 to lead on nine under par after 36 holes. A 51 in the final round gave Barry a 12 under par aggregate of 150 and an eventual winning margin of four shots over John Brohan (Douglas). Brohan the former Cork Hibernians soccer star, shot rounds of 51, 50 and 53. Frank Connolly, of Dublin's Glenville, moved through the field with a final round of 50 to clinch third spot on 155. Lakeside's own Noel Leahy dominated the Junior Championship from start to finish. A stunning opening round of six under par 48 gave him a great boost. He added a second 52 to hold a nine-shot lead heading into the playoff. A 52 in that final round saw him post an aggregate of 10 under par 152 and win by ten shots from Bruff's Joe Ring. Noel Leahy became the first male player from Lakeside to win a national title. John Paul Ivers of Ballycotton in Cork was a model of consistency. He carded three successive rounds of 55 to claim third place.
